THOMAS Analysis: The map shows the distribution of the population by Median age. While there are differences between the various areas shown, not enough information is provided to determine whether the differences are statistically significant. No measure of variation is noted in the map products from the census data. One thing that can be noted - from Maps 1-4, showing the vast majority of the population lived in the southern part of the county, they seem to be younger in the southern region as well.

Note: The median is a measure of central tendency that makes no assumptions with regards to the distribution of the underlying population.
